Resource Group Recaps

Dunedin North Otago

The Dunedin North Otago Resource Group has met every two months through 2019 in locations across the region. Insightful speakers enabled lively table conversations. Shared meals strengthened relationships and led into praying for each other. We marked significant transitions and affirmed the contributions of people to the life of the church in our region. We hosted events to support retired ministers and partners. There were several highlights. A well-attended evening devoted to mental health was timely given the government's initiatives. One of our members, the Rev'd David Clark, Minister of Health, spoke alongside mental health professionals and people with experience of services offered. This is an area to which we will continue to attend. We were also involved in the commissioning of the new Principal at Columba College, one of two schools we continue to support. As well, we heard from those involved in young adult ministry, including at the University of Otago in its 150th year. The University had its beginnings among people of the Presbyterian Church so it was fitting to host its 150th anniversary service. We hosted a service with the Moderator of the General Assembly. The Resource Group is supported by a planning team that continues to look for ways to strengthen our prayerful encouragement of each other in living the way of Jesus Christ.

Mataura Valley

Elder Training - this was held at Calvin Community Church in Gore on 21 June. Two sessions were facilitated by Graham Redding, with a meal and fellowship between. There were 37 present, and all agreed they appreciated the update, especially the historical background of our NZ Presbyterian roots and subsequent Eldership roles.

On the business side, Session Clerks were reminded of the need to register their current Elder representative for Presbytery Gatherings, and future Presbytery functions were advertised.

Clutha

The Clutha Regional Group began the year with a Gathering about Global Mission. Rev. Phil King shared what the PCANZ was supporting and the great work our people were carrying in places like Vanuatu and Myanmar. We were especially interested in the work of Wayne and Helen Harray as several churches are supporting their ministry at Tahan Theological College. In May we heard about Local Mission with speakers from Presbyterian Support programmes - Rest Homes, Community Support, Buddy Programme, and Budget Advice. We are looking forward to a Combined Worship Event at the new Kaitangata Worship Centre to finish the year off together.

General Assembly - Young Adult Commissioner Programme


