Operation Samuel - Young Persons Discipleship Camp

When Riversdale-Waikaia Presbyterian state that they are "fully committed to helping people become wholehearted followers of Jesus Christ" they have no age limit! At the end of January, 10 young people

took part in the church's fourth "Operation Samuel" camp. This is a 6-day discipleship camp for 9-13 year olds, modelled on the 3D training that the Riversdale-Waikaia Parish became known for under John Gullick. The camp is the initiative of Children and Families worker Sarah Cowan, which she trialled first in 2016 and has adapted each year since.



Sarah was assisted by three other leaders, who stayed on-site, and by a large group of church volunteers who helped with food, transport,

teaching sessions and most importantly prayer. Four of the participants this year were 13 and 14 year olds who signed on as "Interns" with extra responsibilities and leadership training sessions during the week. All participants received a personalized course book with Bible verses and words of encouragement on the cover, chosen especially for them by church members who had been praying in advance of camp starting.



Sarah notes as one of her highlights being the four evening sessions where the young people practised *hearing from God*. The children received words of encouragement for each other and were keen to spend extended time waiting and listening for God. Sarah sees this as an important aspect of the week as it helps the young people to "stretch their faith and deepen their relationship with God"

The final day included a day of outdoor adventures at Camp

Columba including the challenging zip line where it was 'awesome to see them all conquering fears and cheering each other on.'

Camp culminated in leading the Sunday service where the young people shared significant growth they had experienced: "God took away my shy and quietness. My favourite session was worship, dancing, love languages, and Holy Spirit." "This week God has communicated with me in many ways, not just directly, but also through the lovely people who gave up their time to speak to us, and also through the other kids." "I honestly think I'm changed forever. All this week I've learned how to really listen to God"

The genuine faith of these ten young Southlanders who devoted a week of their summer to learning how to follow Jesus more fully



and the committed leaders from the wider church community who offered support are an encouragement and a challenge to us all.

There was a great response in 2019 from churches to get up to speed with the new requirements of the PCANZ Child Protection Policy. A friendly reminder for those who haven't responded yet:

- each church leadership appoints a Church Child Protection Officer
- police vetting and WOF safety training is now compulsory for ALL children and youth leaders and helpers (paid and unpaid)

At the 2016 General Assembly the proposal 'Responsible Stewardship of God's Creation' was passed. This proposal set out 10 practical steps for churches to put into practice that would help to reduce their environmental impact. This goes alongside the PCANZ mission statement of Caring for God's Creation.

Unfortunately very little action is being made in regard to this. Many parishes lack the tools, suitable people and time to engage with the issue fully.

But we want to change this. We want to make it easy for churches to put their best foot forward in helping care for God's creation. A workgroup is being put together to address the issues that churches face and will aim to provide an easy pathway for churches to follow to put this proposal into action.
