## Southern Presbytery Spring Gathering Update from Anne!

The workshops will provide practical encouragement, opportunity to learn, and to share our experiences together.

The Presbytery Gathering gives us an opportunity to come together to give thanks to God for the privilege of being able to meet together. But we will also take this opportunity to experiment with how we can use technology to bring us together across distance. ## Presbytery Gathering Workshops:

### • Teaching Like Jesus

#### Led by Rev. Stephanie Wells (Presbyterian Church Schools Resource Office)

For years schools have been using the latest research on how we learn, to educate young people. But how many churches use this knowledge to teach the gospel, even though Jesus demonstrated multiple methods? Come and workshop ways to modify or develop worship and congregational life in order to tap into people's differing learning styles.

### • Life beyond Kids Friendly and Cheryl

### Led by Rev Robin Humphries (Children and Families Ministry director for PCANZ)

Cheryl Harray may be retiring, but the work of reaching children and families with the gospel continues. Robin will explore new directions for this work nationally and in our congregations.

### • Eldership – a practical workshop

#### led by Rev Ken Williams and Rev Erin Pendreigh

An opportunity for elders to explore some scenarios they may encounter in their role. A time for learning and encouragement.

### • Reforming our understandings of contemporary evangelism and conversion

Led by Dr Lynne Taylor, Jack Somerville lecturer in Pastoral Theology, University of Otago This workshop explores why previously unchurched people become Christians today. It outlines what motivates them, the process they follow, and how other Christians help their journey to faith. It will encourage and equip you – because people DO still come to faith, and real people like you can help the process (without doing anything scary!).

#### • Mission, innovation and signs for a new normal



## Final Reflections from Cheryl!

In November as you know I will be retiring. It has been a privilege to serve as the Children and Families (Kids Friendly) Advisor - full time since the establishment of the Southern Presbytery in 2010 (and part-time for Dunedin-North Otago for 2 years before that)

12 years is a long time! Obviously, before I finish I can't revisit every church and person I have had the privilege of walking alongside but I am halfway through last visits around the region as well as planning for a key children's leaders retreat in October.

I am valuing the conversations with others about the many changes that have happened. In my reflections, I have intentionally asked: 'What do I want to share before I finish? What really matters?



So I have <u>FIVE things to share that I believe really matter- they always have mattered but in the last 12</u> years, I have seen research and practice reaffirm the importance of the **HOME** and **INTERGENERATIONAL** ministry as foundations for **LIFE LONG FAITH**. Not only **CHILDREN**, but all ages grow best in these contexts. We have much to learn from each other across all generations and each of us also needs to invest and tend **OUR OWN FAITH** for healthy ministry practice.

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I have summarised my reflections in a short document under these 5 key words called '5 Matters of Children and Families Ministry for Leaders 2020 and beyond' (attached... link here?)

Out of the myriad of resources that are available under these headings I have selected just a few key ones that I highly recommend. I would love you to read and share it widely in your church leadership for ongoing discussion about what really matters in YOUR church. Hard copies will also be available at the Presbytery Gathering and wherever you find me in the next 6 weeks!

Thanks for ALL the ways we have shared together the vision and practice of a church that welcomes, celebrates and nurtures children and families. It's been a fun, challenging and rewarding adventure.

## 5 'Matters' of CHILDREN and FAMILIES Ministry

#### **1. Life-long Faith Matters**

#### II Timothy – Paul shares wisdom with Timothy

Passing on faith is core to the church's purpose. Keep a long view of discipleship in your church from babies to older adults. Understand the "whys" before launching into the 'how and what' No one size fits all. No recipe. Listen, plan, practice, review. #### 2. Children Matter

'Let the children come to me and do not stop them' Luke 18:15-17

Children are spiritual too and able to explore faith from an early age. Highly recommend: "Children's Spirituality – What it is and Why it Matters" Dr Rebecca Nye shares important research and challenges what that will mean for our







content, programmes and relationships with children. Helpful 6 point SPIRIT checklist:

- Space physical and auditory (time to think and answer)
- Process spiritual life is not a product
- Imagination encourage users to help them go deeper
- Relationship at the core- with God, with one another
- Intimacy- creating safe spaces to question and share
- Trust God is at work- take a long view of 'results'

#### 3. Families/households Matter

Deuteronomy 6: 4-9

It's widely recognised that PARENTS are the primary nurturers of their children's faith. Church's role is to support, encourage and equip the home/households of faith to flourish.

There is no shortage of resources available but that can be part of the challenge. What do churches choose to focus on to support their parents without sending them on a guilt trip about all the things they are NOT doing? Below is ONE idea and resource that could make a big difference if practised regularly.

**FAITH5** Faith Acts In The Home is a simple, easy-to-implement faith practice. When done over time, the <u>FAITH5<sup>M</sup></u> carries the power to enrich communication, deepen understanding and promote mental, physical and spiritual health for everyone in the family.

#### FAITH S Here is the FAITH 5 (five minutes and five steps) that can change a family

1. **Share** your *Highs & Lows* of the day (the best and worst thing that happened)

- 2. **Read** a Bible verse or story
- 3. Talk about how the Bible reading might relate to your Highs & Lows
- 4. Pray for one another's highs and lows.
- 5. Bless one another before turning the lights out each night

What if ALL the households of faith in your congregation started practicing Faith5 regularly!

#### **4. All Ages Together Matter -Intergenerational Ministry** *Psalm 78:1-7*

Doing more TOGETHER is the other key challenge and focus of direction and resources in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Research is showing that alongside INFORMATION, experiences that encourage FORMATION are needed for ALL ages to grow in faith as life-long followers of Jesus for TRANSFORMATION.


Faith is caught more than taught and is passed on best when churches "intentionally bring the generations together in mutual serving, sharing and learning in order to live out being the body of Christ to one another and the greater community."

"Intergenerational Christian Formation" By Holly Catterton Allen and Christine Lawton Ross (a dense read but highly recommended)

**'Intergenerate'** tackles the important question 'How can we bring the generations back together?' Each chapter is a keynote address or workshop from the Intergenerate conference (2018) representing multi ages, countries and denominations. 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#### 5. YOU Matter!

"Come to me. Get away with me and you will recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me, work with me and watch how I do it... learn the unforced rhythms of grace." Matthew 11:28-30 (The Message)

You can't keep giving out in Christian ministry if you are empty and worn down. Take time to discover and regularly practise rhythms of spiritual nurture that help YOU keep close to God and 'fill your tank' (Bible reading, study, prayer practices, physical exercise, sharing with friends, rest and refreshment ....)


