A Message from the Moderators

To our Presbyterian family in the South: Grace to you and peace from God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

As we live through another lockdown, we remember that we have been here before. Last year's lockdown saw the development of new creative ways of connecting together for Sunday services via the internet. It was a huge learning curve for all involved, and the knowledge and competency in using this technology continues to be such a blessing in keeping us connected. We now know what to do, because we've been there before. Since the last lockdown, resources. Thank you to everyone who is working hard to ensure this continues.

Pastoral phone calls, texts, Zoom and FaceTime catch ups are very important tools to use both within our congregations and to connect with those who may be on the fringes in our parishes. Taking a few minutes to check in with someone can mean the world to them. Loneliness is huge, especially for those living on their own: To have get a friendly phone call from someone is much appreciated. *Thank you* to everybody making those calls, and checking in.

Following COVID19 guidelines is one of the ways that we support our neighbours, our community, our country: staying home in Level 4, wearing masks, getting vaccinated for our own safety but even more for the wellbeing of those around us. We have an opportunity to "love one another" in a very practical way, by accepting what may seem like inconvenience so that we can look after others. This is another way we can "bear one another's burdens" (Galatians 6:2)

We, your Moderators of the Southern Presbytery and Synod of Otago and Southland, invite you to join us in prayer for our people in the South, asking for God's strength and wisdom to guide us through this time, and for God's protecting hand to be with us and all the people of Aotearoa New Zealand. - We give thanks for the work being done in our communities by essential workers, whether medical workers or supermarket staff or courier drivers or those keeping infrastructure going

The Committee have noted that in recent times there have been very few applications for new mission initiatives. We realise that existing mission work can and often does expand or develop into new areas of mission so on-going applications for funding of existing work assists with that. Covid-19 lockdowns have impacted significantly on most if not all parishes' finances and that may have put Church Councils into a cautionary mindset on how more scarce funds are spent. However, Christians need to continue to take God's mission to the community forward even in more uncertain economic times. The Mission & Evangelism Committee would like to encourage Church Councils to prayerfully consider what new mission and evangelism work God is calling them to, and if that needs some assistance in funding and qualifies for funding under our rules then we would welcome your applications. Please note we look carefully to see that the Church Council's missional heart is in applications and that they are putting up some funding themselves to demonstrate that they really believe God is calling them to this Mission and Evangelism work. If you would like help with your parishes' mission, please contact Erin Pendreigh, Mission Advisor. If you need to discuss the rules or how to make an application please contact Fergus Sime, Executive Officer. Applications close on 15 October and 15 June each year.

The **Ecclesiastical Fund** applications close annually on 15 October. This fund is for church property expenditure. Qualifying expenditure includes land and building purchases, alterations, major and routine maintenance. For further details please contact Fergus Sime, Executive Officer.

The **Educational Fund** applications close on 30 November annually. This fund is for Christian and/or secular education and is open to any educational group in the Synod area. More parishes could be applying to this fund if they had educational projects they wanted to seek assistance with funding for. For further details please contact Fergus Sime, Executive Officer.
