From the Moderator of Southern Presbytery

What a privilege it has been over the past two years to serve as Moderator of the Southern Presbytery. I'm sorry I haven't met all of you - but I am very grateful for the opportunities I have had to meet many of you.

Two years ago we were beginning to get our heads around COVID and the differences that would make to our lives - but I think that back then we thought we might be getting to the end of it. Little did we know that this was a marathon, not a sprint, and that the more challenging parts were still to come, as different people responded in different ways to what was asked of us. Vaccine mandates were the most difficult, because they seemed to go right against our call to welcome all people - and yet it was important to show love for one another by protecting the vulnerable among us. On the whole we managed to keep talking to one another even when we responded differently to these challenges. It helped when we remembered that our common commitment to follow Jesus came before our different responses. That is one of the lessons we need to take with us out of this time - how to respect one another as brothers and sisters in Christ even when we differ about matters that we consider to be really important.

Over the past two years as Moderator I have ordained one minister, inducted eight ministers into parishes, commissioned our Children and Families Ministry advisor, closed three church buildings and dissolved four parishes. That is probably a good reflection of life across the presbytery - a mixture of new ministries beginning and the end of other long-established parishes. The church as we have known it is in a time of decline and endings and transitions - I have been reminded of the image of the potter at the potter's wheel in Jeremiah 18. There are times when the clay which was being shaped into one vessel is squashed back down to a shapeless lump of clay - so that the potter can reshape it differently, so that it can be fit for purpose in a new time. My prayer for the Southern Presbytery is that we will remain malleable in God's hands, allowing God to reshape us into whatever new thing will be fit for God's purpose in the future. Even when it seems that everything is being reduced to formless nothingness, our hope lies in the skill and creativity of our potter God.

Thank you to Alan Judge for his support and advice and knowledge, and to the members of Presbytery Council and those who are on Presbytery workgroups for all their work. And thank you to James Watt for his willingness to say 'yes' to God's call through the Presbytery to be Moderator. May God continue to bless us all in the Southern Presbytery and use us to be a blessing in our communities throughout the South.

Presbytery Updates

Next Presbytery – New Moderator

We meet next as Presbytery in Cromwell on November 4th and 5th (beginning at 7pm). On Friday evening we will gather to worship together and induct James Watt to be our new moderator.

The Grief of Endings

During the Friday afternoon of November 4th, Rev Silvia Purdie will lead a workshop on the theme **The Grief of Endings** – below is a description – the workshop is for Elders, Ministers and others in Church leadership.

Ministry and church life involves endings as well as new beginnings, but we are not always good at dealing with them. Many of us in ministry carry past hurts, and many congregations are grappling with grief as churches shrink or close. Silvia Purdie has recently published a book: Moving On: grief in ministry transition. She interviewed over 50 people, mostly in the Presbyterian church, from different cultures, discussing a breadth of topics, such as how change affects children and young people, together with biblical, theological and pastoral reflection. Her work includes recommendations for the church as well as liturgy for farewell and healing.

Silvia will lead a 2 hour session sharing her insights into this important topic, as well as discussion and prayer.

Presbytery Review

The June Presbytery meeting asked for an external Presbytery Review to be established. Review Team members have been approached and terms of reference prepared. It is expected the review will be completed around May 2023.

The convener is the Rev Dr Alan Missen and other members Rev Clare Lind, Judith Forbes and Rev Malcolm Gordon.

A survey has been sent out throughout the Presbytery to begin the process of hearing from the Presbytery. Following this other review processes will be advised.


Ministry Retirements

Revs Kerry Enright, Martin Macaulay and Geoff Skilton have each recently indicated they wish to retire and each been granted the status of minister emeritus. Revs Kerry Enright and Geoff Skilton and Barry Kelk have asked to become Senior Active Ministers of the Presbytery.

Candidates Workgroup

Margie Rea has been assessed by Candidates Workgroup as having completed the requirements her LOM probation successfully and ready to move to ordination shortly. Crookston Kiwi-Church are considering a ministry appointment for Margie to be ordained into.

This workgroup has also asked Presbytery to begin training Rachael Masterton in the LOM probationer programme with Coastal Unity Parish, and this is approved by Presbytery Council. Details are being put in place over the coming months.

Good News Stories


