A MESSAGE FROM REV ROSE LUXFORD, MODERATOR ELECT

Warm greetings to you all.

I have invited the Rev Dr Andrew Callander to be the keynote speaker at Assembly and he will be speaking twice – on Thursday and Friday afternoons.

I met Andrew a few years ago when we both did some training for transitional ministry. Part of the training focussed on some work by Rob Voyle "An appreciative inquiry paradigm for transitional ministry".

The idea of this is to focus on what is working in a parish and build on that, rather than putting all the focus on what is wrong and sinking into despair. Yes, we need to be realistic about what is happening, but we also need to see what is working, see where the energy and the signs of hope are, and build on that.

Since our training, Andrew has written and spoken on this theme in relation to how we present the gospel and I believe his work to be stimulating, thought-provoking and helpful. Andrew has woven into his keynote addresses my theme of 'Authentic and Hopeful in Christ'.

Over my years in ministry, I have seen how important it is to be authentic in the different contexts we are in. Being who we are in Christ, being comfortable in our own skin, and being in tune with our particular context, can really enrich and encourage our places of ministry.

We live in challenging times in the Church, and it can sometimes be a struggle to keep a sense of hope. And yet we are people of the resurrection and as such are bearers of hope.

A little blessing that I like that seems apt for us all:

May the God of dreams and visions, Enable you to dream creatively And to hear the dreaming of others – Young and old – in your community. May you be open to new ideas, Dare to share visions, Be encouraged to hope.*

Lunch on Thursday, Friday & Saturday, and dinner on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday & Saturday are included, as are morning/afternoonteas. NOTE: Breakfast is ONLY included for those guests with a confirmed booking at Bruce House.

Book accommodation early!



On site accommodation at Bruce House is filling up fast. The nightly rate of \$75 includes a continental breakfast, served from 7.00 – 8.00am in the Bruce House dining hall.

Available room options have 4, 5 or 6 beds. All bedding will be supplied but bring your own towel.

The **Upper Villa, Lower Villa, and the Lodge**, have shared bathroom facilities - each will house either men or women. The Quad accommodation block, which will house both men and women, has separate bathroom facilities for each. These facilities are external to the Quad accommodation block.

There is a car park adjacent to Bruce House.
