Greetings

Dear Southern Presbyterians,

The Path, the Truth, and the Energy of Life

I was sitting in church recently reading these words from John 14 on the screen...

Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?' Jesus answered, 'I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you really know me, you will know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him.'

Like you I've read those words many times before. But this time I was struck by the contrast between Thomas' question and Jesus response. Thomas is talking about going somewhere and plans to get there, at one level he is asking for directions. In response Jesus reshapes the conversation making it less about finding the way to somewhere and more about being fully present with Jesus in every place we find ourselves. "I am the way, the truth and the life". The Message translates this as "I am the road, also the truth, also the life" and a recent translation THE VOICE as "I am the path, the truth, and the energy of life."

During my life I've been to a lot of church seminars which are 'futuristic'. The focus is on moving on into a different space in Church life. We have in a sense been looking for the new way to be the Church. In these 40 years there has been a lot of experimenting, a lot of change. But I'm not sure we have gone anywhere. Perhaps these verses are calling us back to Jesus who has been with us all the way through. Is Jesus saying he is the path into God's truth and life?

How do you think of your calling, as individual and churches – is it to go somewhere else or be a different church; maybe it is to stay – to stay with the church as it is – and dwell in the presence of Jesus who is our life, who is our truth, who is our roadside. What would it be like for you to be more fully present with Jesus in every place we find ourselves.

2018 Spring Presbytery Gathering

On September 7th and 8th Southern Presbytery met for our Spring Gathering. We had 82 Presbytery members and another 17 associates and a varied programme.

A highlight was the induction of our new Moderator Rev Andrew Scott who inspired and challenged us as we live together as a Presbytery of 70 parishes. This was a very happy and grace filled Presbytery where we were able to affirm many who live and work as part of the Presbytery.

We were meeting at John McGlashan College and took the opportunity to hear some of the vision of that College as a Christian and Presbyterian School. We also took time to greet Ministry Interns and LOM probationers beginning ministry in our parishes.

An update was provided on the work of the Presbytery Review and Development Group and we heard plans to consult further with the Presbytery as recommendations are developed. This group is asking some deep questions about how we shape our life as a Presbytery.

Financial discussions took place on Saturday as the challenges were outlined and ways to address them were considered in small groups and with the whole Presbytery. A balanced budget was approved and levies increased to allow this to happen. In addition the following notice of motion was approved: That in order to support the financial viability and health of the Southern Presbytery, parishes and church members be invited to prayerfully consider giving more than their stated levy if they are able.

Plans were made for the dates of next year's Presbytery Gatherings which will be held on Saturday 23rd February 2019 with the Spring Presbytery Gathering on Friday and Saturday August 23rd and 24th 2019. Please note these dates in diaries now. We accepted nominations made by our Nominations Workgroup for people to serve on Presbytery Council and our workgroups.

It was noted that this September is the 125th anniversary of women gaining the vote in our Parliamentary elections and we encouraged one another to reflect on this occasion and women's place in church and society in our worship services during September.

The Seedling Presbyterian Community in South Dunedin

What is The Seedling?

The Seedling is a new Presbyterian ministry in South Dunedin. Our vision is to establish a new missional community that:

- is embedded in the South Dunedin neighbourhood
- bears witness to the good news of Jesus through a shared life of prayer, worship, hospitality, and service
- creates welcoming spaces where community relationships can grow
- is attentive to the gifts and needs of the South Dunedin neighbourhood and its residents
- supports and advocates for South Dunedin residents around social issues, in collaboration with other local ministries and organisations
- provides a missional context where young adults can explore discipleship

The Seedling is an initiative of the Southern Presbytery, Presbyterian Support Otago, and the Knox Centre of Ministry and Leadership, and is generously resourced by the Synod of Otago and Southland, local parishes, and individual giving.

The ministry of The Seedling began earlier this year. In August, the Presbytery inducted Jono Ryan as minister for this new initiative. He is joined by Gabe Hawker, who has a role with The Seedling as part of his KCML internship. Our focus in these initial months has been on discernment: considering the shape of missional community in South Dunedin, meeting and learning from others in the neighbourhood, and exploring opportunities to serve. We have also begun gathering for a reflective worship service on Sundays, 4.30–5.30pm, meeting in the Family Works office in South Dunedin (details below). You are welcome to visit!

We Need Your Help!

The image of a seedling expresses both the life and potential of this new ministry, and also its fragility in these early stages. To grow and establish strong roots, we need the support of the wider church. Can you help us? An immediate need is for a few more people to come alongside us in this work. Specifically, we are hoping for:

• some people to join our missional community: ideally this involves being based in South Dunedin, and sharing in our activities of prayer, hospitality etc. during the week

• some people to provide a supportive presence over a fixed-term (e.g. 1-2 years), by joining us for worship on Sundays at 4.30pm, and participating in some of our activities in South Dunedin

Additionally, we'd like to encourage more students/young adults to join us in South Dunedin, either by living here as part of our missional community, or by sharing in some of our other activities.

Are interested in being involved? Or can you think of someone else who might be? We'd love to hear from you. If you'd like to find out more first, we would be happy to have a "no strings attached" chat over coffee. We would also be grateful for your prayers, especially for the needs outlined above. If you'd like to learn more about our ministry, and opportunities to support it, do get in contact, and we would be happy to meet with you or your church community.
