Greetings everyone

As I write, the Advent and Christmas season is upon us - churches around our region are being decorated, with many preparations and practices to celebrate the Christmas story with congregations



and the wider community. What GOOD NEWS we have to share!

In fact 66% of our churches said in the recent Children and Families survey that they have a special event Sunday at Christmas time and noted this was a time when more children and families attend. 64% of churches also provide or participate in a community Christmas event, making the most of an open opportunity to share the Christmas story with interested people who have never heard it before (not just children either!)

May God bless you with ideas, energy and generous hospitality as you invite people to hear and participate in your community. I know many churches are giving away the free Bible Society booklets 'The Well Good News of Christmas' or gifting the Advent Tree journey kits to families, performing impromptu or practiced Nativity plays and accessing some of the excellent videos available.

One new video I came across this week explores the theme of the MESS of Christmas. And let's face it there was plenty of risk and mess in the Christmas story. What was God thinking?....an unmarried mother, hurried wedding, unplanned travel, no accommodation booking, unusual birthplace, smelly

shepherds as first witnesses, supernatural phenomena, puzzling prophesy in the temple, strange visit from foreign travellers with precious gifts, volatile political climate, flight as refugees, horrendous crime

against children by power-hungry ruler...it was messy!

But that is just the point being made in the video-Jesus didn't come to be remembered in a sanitised, cute nativity scene. Zoom out and recall God's BIG plan and promise, before and after. (Advent helps us do this) Jesus came into the MESS of our world with a message of hope for all humankind. Watch the video – 4min 38sec – find out what the narrator is making as wanders around a Welsh farm, chatting in rhyme – all is revealed at the end with a clever play on the word MESS.
